# **Target Business Size**

#### Xero: Small to Medium Sized Businesses

Xero is primarily designed for small to medium sized businesses and is a great choice for start-ups or businesses in the early stages of growth. It's particularly well-suited for service-based businesses, retail, and other industries with relatively straightforward operations.





### **Pegasus Opera: Medium Sized Businesses**

Pegasus Opera caters to businesses with more complex needs, often with a manufacturing or distribution focus. It's designed to handle a larger volume of transactions and a more intricate business structure.

### **Dynamics 365 Business Central: Medium to Large Enterprises**

Business Central is a comprehensive ERP system that can support businesses with hundreds or even thousands of employees. It's suitable for organisations with complex operations, multiple locations, and a need for advanced functionality.

# **Deployment**

#### **Xero: Cloud-based**

Xero is exclusively a cloud-based solution. This means it's accessible from any internet-connected device, making it highly flexible for businesses and their employees. There's no need for on-premise hardware or software installations.

### Pegasus Opera: On-premise or Cloud-based

Pegasus Opera offers both on-premise and cloud-based deployment options. An on-premise deployment requires the software to be installed on the company's servers, while a cloud-based version is hosted by Pegasus. Hosting can also be provided by Synergy Technology through a third-party provider, like Citadel Technology.



### **Dynamics 365 Business Central: Cloud-based**

Similar to Pegasus Opera, Dynamics 365 Business Central can be deployed either in the cloud or on-premise. However, that means that you need to have sufficient IT resources in-house to install product updates and maintain your software and hardware. # Configurability

Configurability refers to the ability to modify a software system to fit a company's specific business processes without the need for bespoke coding and customisation. Let's compare the three platforms:

Xero: Low Configurability

Xero is primarily focused on accounting and financial management. While it offers some customisation options for workflows, reports, and dashboards, its core functionality is relatively fixed. It's best suited for small to medium-sized businesses with straightforward financial needs.

Pegasus Opera: Medium to High Configurability

Pegasus Opera is a more comprehensive ERP system that allows for a higher degree of customisation. It offers options to modify workflows, screens, and reports to align with specific business processes. This makes it suitable for businesses with more complex operations and industry-specific requirements, especially those in the Manufacturing or Distribution Industries.
